

# Promoting British Values at Lindfield Primary Academy

## *The Rule of Law*

- School behaviour policy
- Pupils have regular opportunities to reflect on their behaviour during assemblies
- School has strong links with local emergency services
- Behaviour code established with the children in each classroom
- Importance of school rules emphasised and reinforced during the school day

## *Democracy*

- Class rules are discussed and voted on by pupils
- House Captains and School Council representatives are selected solely on pupil vote
- Pupils help to develop the school policies
- Pupils are taught to listen carefully to, and respect the opinions of others
- Pupils are able to raise concerns and share opinions or ideas with the School Council

## *Mutual Respect*

- Pupils are given regular opportunities to work as part of a team
- School has a strong set of rights and responsibilities that are referred to and understood by the pupils
- Staff demonstrate respect and emphasise it with the pupils throughout the school day
- The core value of Respect underpins all work

## *Tolerance of culture, faith and others*

- We use a range of opportunities, such as the Olympics, to learn about different cultures
- Pupils learn about and visit different places of worship from different faiths
- Pupils have an understanding of different faiths and beliefs through R.E. and PSHE
- We welcome visitors in to our school and enjoy them sharing their knowledge with us

## *Individual Liberty*

- Pupils are often given a choice in the level of challenge of their work
- A range of after school clubs are offered for children to choose from
- Boundaries are set and pupils understand they need to work within these to make safe choices
- Pupils are encouraged to make choices
