Details

Mid-Sussex Active:

- The PE Coordinator has attended a Primary PE conference in Bognor Regis to develop subject leader knowledge
- PE coordinator has attended networking sessions run by Mid-Sussex Active to allow the organisation of inter school competitions
- The PE Coordinator attended a course on inclusive PE and on whole school improvement through PE.
- Opportunities for teachers and the PE coordinator to attend twilight CPD sessions in various sports.
- The three NQTs within our school have been on 3 separate courses to improve their teaching and understanding of children's learning in PE (dance, gym, striking and fielding)
- A group of Year 6 children have attended a Sports Crew course and have since delivered a number of intra school competitions throughout the year.
- Our Sports Crew have also supported the running of lunch time intra-school competitions and lunch/break time activities.
- The school has sent teams (including B & C teams) to over 25 different competitions (run or assisted by Mid-Sussex Active or Mid-Sussex Primary Association) in over 14 different sports. These numbers should rise by July 2017 to over 30 competitions in 17 different sports.
- Mid-Sussex Active have provided advice and support on the effective use of the Sport's Premium
- Mid-Sussex have given guidance on tracking our student participation in sport
- Year 10 sport's leaders will have supported the running of different events throughout the year
- Mid-Sussex Active have provided us with support when applying for our Youth Sport Trust Mark
- MSA have helped organise links with local sport clubs to provide afterschool sporting clubs run by professionals

Premier Sport's coaching:

- Premier Sports have provided at least 6 sessions of CPD for 16 teachers in the school
- Teachers have been allowed to choose which area they would like support in
- Premier Sports have provided planning and assessment which can be accessed by other teachers throughout the school
- In term 5 Premier Sports are assessing our strengths and weaknesses and will be teaching alongside teachers to continue to improve the teaching of PE.

Supply Cover:

• Supply cover has been provided for those teachers who have attended courses to develop their delivery of the PE curriculum and to take children to participate in inter-school competitions.
